Our Vision

Douglas County Libraries (DCL) elevates our community by inspiring a love of reading, discovery and connection.

Formed in 1990, we are now the fourth-largest library system in Colorado, with seven locations serving two million visitors annually. Ranked for several years among the best-performing U.S. public library systems for the population it serves, DCL plays a vital role in the life of our community, offering myriad events, programs and services for kids, teens and adults.

Douglas County Libraries lends nearly seven million books, DVDs, magazines, e-books and audiobooks every year, including more children's materials than any other Colorado library. Our seven locations offer a large collection of popular materials; children's books; reference materials and research tools; downloadable audio, video and e-books; wireless access; public internet stations; and friendly, professional staff. We also provide reading recommendations and online access to Douglas County history and community information.

We offer signature events for all ages; more than 75 Storytimes each week; children's and teen writing groups and book clubs; used book sales; and a variety of interesting events that engage, educate and entertain patrons of all ages. Study rooms, meetings rooms and event venues are available to the public.

EVENT HALL, \$50,000 Investment

This space, where community and library meet, will provide myriad opportunities to engage and entertain the public. It's the perfect setting for hosting events from social functions to business meetings, to educational and entertaining programs.

- Windows overlooking Civic Green Park to bring the “outdoors indoors.”
- Features moveable walls, ceiling mounted projector, large screen, and hearing loop technology.

CHILDREN'S EDUCATIONAL/INTERACTIVE WALL, \$30,000 Investment

Creative and mesmerizing, this prominent fixture promotes experiential learning. Investment duration will be for the life of the structure.

KIDS CORNER, \$25,000 Investment

This space offers a wide range of experiences, learning and physical activity, and demonstrates the library's unique capacity for spaces where children and families come together to acquire information and knowledge in a creative and entertaining manner.

THE MARKET, \$25,000 Investment

This interactive, museum-quality farm-to-table play market and kitchen in the children's area offers a play-as-learning experience that includes carts, aprons, “food” – all the things necessary to create a fun, hands-on educational experience.

FAMILY ROOM with FIREPLACE, \$25,000 Investment

Cozy, sleek and comfortable furniture characterize this family area for quiet reading, games and all around family together time.

STUDY ROOMS (5), \$15,000 Investment Each

Rooms may be private or provide collaboration depending on community needs. One study room will be located on the first floor and four on the second floor; each room is equipped with wall mounts for tablets/screens/monitors, and accommodates 4-5 or 5-8 people in comfortable surroundings, depending on the room size.

SEMI-PRIVATE STUDY AREA, \$15,000 Investment

This room, located on the first floor adjacent to the Learning Commons, will accommodate 6-8 people. The room may be set up for formal meetings or in a more casual, comfortable style.

CONFERENCE ROOM, \$15,000 Investment

This traditional business-style room is great for presentations, Skype, and other collaborative work. The room seats up to 40 people, and can accommodate more with expansion into the library.

THE LOFT, \$15,000 Investment

This room is a non-traditional meeting space for those who desire upscale and comfy options. Its semi-private and flexible atmosphere allows guests to comfortably converse, present and collaborate.

LEARNING COMMONS, \$10,000 Investment

This energizing and flexible environment on the first floor provides a place for students and adults to engage in diverse learning activities, from group collaboration to individual study, using modern technology.

“TECH IT OUT” LAPTOP DISPENSER, \$5,000 Investment

Highly visible near essential library service points, the dispenser integrates laptop borrowing into library services, and provides a computing alternative for patrons without their own portable devices.

FLAGPOLE, \$2,500 Investment

An “out-front” opportunity to commemorate loved ones or celebrate events; includes a dedication plaque.
